USSSA 9 & UNDER OPEN USSSA WORLD SERIES TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Tournament Format Note: The **2009 9 & Under Open USSSA Baseball World Series** will be conducted under a pool play onto a double-elimination championship bracket or a single-elimination consolation bracket, as per USSSA baseball rules. Teams will be placed in pools where they will play a round robin within their pool. Teams will then be placed onto a Championship bracket or a Consolation bracket following pool play. The exact format of the tournament (e.g., number of pools, number of teams in each pool, etc.) will be set by the Tournament Director following USSSA Baseball guidelines and being approved by the USSSA Baseball National Committee.

NOTE: USSSA World Series are seeded based on points accumulated in USSSA tournaments and additional criteria such as separating entries from the same state, if possible. Also, a list of teams entering the tournament will not be provided in advance in accordance with recommendations from USSSA. Thanks.

Tournament Schedule: Teams will play two pool play games on Sunday, July 19, 2009. Teams will then play one pool play game on Monday, July 20, 2009. Bracket play will begin on Tuesday, July 21, 2009 with eight teams advancing to a double elimination championship bracket and the next four teams going to a consolation bracket.

NOTE: Teams should expect to play a minimum of 5 games, weather permitting.

Skills Competition Details: The overall objective of the skills competition is to have every player on each team participate and enjoy the social interaction of this tremendous event. No player may enter more than one event. The events for the Skills Competition will be:

1. **Round The Horn (5 Players):** Five (5) players from each team will be allowed to participate. The players will take their positions in the infield (1B, 2B, 3B, SS, C). The catcher will start the event. The catcher will throw to third baseman, third-baseman throws to second baseman, second-baseman throws to shortstop, shortstop throws to first-baseman and first-baseman throws to catcher. The time will start when the catcher throws and time will stop when the catcher receives the throw from the first-baseman. **ANY DROPPED BALLS OR BAD THROWS ARE CONSIDERED LIVE AND TIME WILL KEEP RUNNING!**
2. **Accuracy Throw (3 Players):** Three (3) players on each team can participate. Each player will get three (3) throws to hit the target. Players must throw behind the marked position on the field. **PLAYERS WILL BE AWARDED 1PT FOR BOUNCING THE BALL INTO THE TARGET AND 5 PTS FOR HITTING THE TARGET ON THE FLY.**
3. **Base Running (4 Players):** Four (4) players from each team will be allowed to participate. Each player will start inside the batters box and run the bases. **TIME WILL START ON FIRST STEP AND END WHEN TOUCHING HOME PLATE.** (NOTE: Any additional player who has not participated in any event may participate in this event in excess of the four allowed entries.)

Manager's Meeting: Two representatives from each team will be permitted to attend this meeting. All teams **are required** to have a representative in attendance. The official schedule will be distributed at this meeting. Game procedures, etc. will be reviewed at this meeting. This meeting will begin at 11:00 AM in Plaza 3 at the Doubletree Hotel on Saturday, July 18, 2009.

Team Representative/Team Mom's Meeting: All teams should have at least one representative at this meeting. **ALL pre-orders will be distributed at this meeting.** (NOTE: Adjustments to pre-orders will be made at this meeting only!) Important information about the player social, opening ceremonies, team photos etc. will be discussed at this meeting. This meeting will begin at 12:30 PM in Plaza 3 at the Doubletree Hotel on Saturday, July 18, 2009. NOTE: Tickets for the Opening Ceremonies/Cardinals Game will be distributed at this meeting. The game is a sellout. The only remaining tickets are those set aside for the 9U Open World Series Participants and Fans.

Team Check-in: Teams have been assigned a check-in time for Saturday, July 18, 2009, beginning at 1:30 PM and going until 3:00 PM in the Plaza 4 meeting room at the Doubletree Hotel. Team Rosters and player birth certificates will be verified at this time. Teams should report for check-in wearing their uniform for a team picture after check-in. Team members, along with no more than two coaches will be required to verify birth certificates against the team's Official On-Line USSSA Roster. Rosters will be provided by each state director. Coaches will be required to bring all players and the birth certificates for all players to the Check-In for verification. **Also, teams should check their rosters as First and Last Names MUST match exactly as they appear on the birth certificate. Middle names should NOT be listed.** (NOTE: All players must be present at Team Check-In.)

Field Restrictions: The BC Baseball League has a policy of NOT allowing any outside food or drinks to be brought into the complexes used for its tournaments and this includes the Ellisville Athletic Association and the Pond Athletic Association. No bottles, cans, jugs or coolers may be brought into the complex. There is a full-service concession stand on premises. Also food is not to be cooked in the parking lot area for safety and health code reasons. We appreciate your cooperation; however, we also reserve the right to inspect bags, etc. which are brought into the complex. If food or drink (which includes bottled water, flavored water, sports water or Gatorade type products) is brought into the complex, *it will be confiscated. Review this information with your parents and players so we DO NOT have to interrupt game and/or your coaching to deal with this!* Team water coolers are permissible as they will NOT be provided at either location. We also ask that you not bring pets into the complex – nor scooters, skate boards, etc.

Field Notes: Games will be played at the Ellisville Athletic Association complex. There are a total of 6 fields which can be used at the complex. These fields are dirt infields with portable pitching mounds.

Tourney Shirts: A tournament T-Shirt will be available for \$20 each. A limited number of shirts will be available in adult and youth large sizes. For team orders of 10 or more paid for all at one time, the price will be \$18.00 per shirt. To assure your team of receiving the World Series Souvenir T-Shirt, a [Souvenir T-Shirt Advance Order Form](#) is included in this packet. Utilize this form to order your shirts in advance of the World Series. Shirts ordered no later than 1:00 PM on Wednesday, July 15, 2009 will be guaranteed availability. Other items also will be available such as a World Series pin, souvenir bat, etc. See the order form which follows this packet.

Tourney Photos: Team photos and action photos will be taken. Information will be provided at the Manager's Meeting and Team Mom's Meeting.

Weather Phone Number: Schedule changes will be updated on the BC Baseball web site (www.bcbaseball.org) and then click through to the St. Louis area info). We also will use a Hotline Number during the tournament for immediate weather info. That phone number is (573) 442-3693.

Warm-up Notes: *SOFT TOSS INTO THE FENCE ON ANY FIELD IS NOT ALLOWED.* Once teams take the actual game field, all throwing warm-up should be held in the outfield grass area. Once any field prep and maintenance (batter's box and pitching plate work and field lining) has been completed, teams may take ground balls before the game by splitting the field; however, *no full infield will be allowed.* At any field where pitchers warm up on the field, pitchers are to warm-up in the outfield foul area prior to the game and during the game. The pitcher is to throw towards the outfield fence parallel to the foul line. During the game, when a pitcher is being warmed up, a protector (a coach with a glove or player wearing a helmet and glove) is to accompany the pitcher and warm-up catcher with the protector to be stationed between the pitcher and batter facing the batter.

Tournament Rules: The tournament will be conducted under the rules of the USSSA, as published in the USSSA Baseball National By-Laws. All coaches are reminded and recommended to review all items under **ARTICLE VIII: USSSA BASEBALL PLAYING RULES**, most particularly **ITEM IV: GAME RULES**, which contains information on run rules, courtesy runner, re-entry, extra hitter, pitching limitations and pool-play advancement. Coaches also should review the USSSA sportsmanship rules for coaches, players and parents, as these will be followed and enforced. If you do not have a USSSA rule book, these rules can be referenced at www.USSSABaseball.org.

USSSA Sportsmanship & BC Baseball Fan Conduct Rule: The USSSA takes the matter of proper sportsmanship seriously. The Head Coach of each team is responsible for the behavior of his assistant coaches, parents, fans and players. Should the umpires have any issue in regards to improper conduct with assistant coaches, parents or players, the Head Coach will be held responsible. BC Baseball has one simple rule, which will be in effect for all tournaments it administers, "If a parent or fan is ejected from the park, the Head Coach will be ejected as well and will be required to escort that parent or fan to the parking lot immediately."

USSSA PITCHING LIMITATIONS RULES

8.08.G (Chart 8.08.G-1) The end of the day for the pitching limitation rules is the time of day or night when the ballpark is shut-down and the teams go home for the night break. Games that for any reason extend past midnight (12:00 AM) or start late at night, past midnight (12:00 AM) and are completed before the teams take the night break, will count as being played on the scheduled day. A game not completed before the night break per Rule 8.04.N, shall be a suspended game per Rule 8.04.O. Suspended games, when resumed (the next day or another day), shall count as being played on two different days. The outs recorded during the part of the game played before suspension shall count as being played on the regularly scheduled day. The outs recorded during the part of the game played once resumed, shall count as being played on the resumed day.

8.08.G.1 Column A: The maximum number of innings a player can pitch in one (1) day.

8.08.G.2 Column B: The maximum number of innings a player can pitch in three (3) consecutive days.

Rule 8.08.G.2 Approved Ruling: The three (3) consecutive days cycle begins on the day a pitcher records his first legal out and ends two days later. A day of rest within this three (3) day sequence **DOES NOT** start the three (3) consecutive days cycle anew.

Rule 8.08.G.2 Comment: For age divisions 7U – 12U, this is to be interpreted as a player can pitch any combination of innings that equals nine (9) as long as he doesn't pitch more than six (6) innings in any one day pursuant to Rule 8.08.G.1.

Rule 8.08.G.2 Comment: For age divisions 13U – 14U, this is to be interpreted as a player can pitch any combination of innings that equals eleven (11) as long as he doesn't pitch more than seven (7) innings in any one day pursuant to Rule 8.08.G.1.

8.08.G.3 In age divisions 7U – 14U, any player that pitches three (3) consecutive days must rest the next day.

8.08.G.4 For all cumulative totals in this rule, one (1) out equals one-third (1/3) of an inning, two (2) outs equals two-thirds (2/3) of an inning and three (3) outs equals one (1) full inning. A pitcher that pitches in a game and records no outs is not charged with any innings pitched.

8.08.G.5 Outs recorded during a game that ends in forfeit shall count towards a pitchers' innings limits.

8.08.G.6 For purposes of pitching limitations rules, a pitcher is in violation of the rule if he records any out above the legal pitching limits pursuant to these rules.

Rule 8.08.G.6 Exception: Exceeding the maximum innings allowed in the case of a double or triple play shall not be counted against the pitcher.

Rule 8.08.G.6 Penalty: It shall be the responsibility of each team manager to challenge pitching violations by notifying the Umpire-in-Chief and then filing a Protest with the League / Tournament Director. A protest may be filed at any point after the pitcher in violation records an out beyond his legal limit **AND** while the pitcher in violation is in the game and in the pitching position. If such violation is the last recorded out of the game, the protest **MUST** be filed prior to the umpires and the protesting team leaving the field of play. Any violation of pitching limitations Rule 8.08.G.1 – 8.08.G.6 shall result in immediate forfeiture of the game. If such violation occurs during Pool-Play, the team in violation of the Rule may not advance to the championship bracket regardless of record.

RULE 13.00 – PROTESTS

13.01 Umpires will work to settle all situations on the field. Protests will be allowed for age and pitching violations or rule interpretations only. Protests must be declared to the Umpire-in-Chief and then to the League / Tournament Director before the next pitch following the dispute. If a call to be protested is the last recorded out of a game or on a game ending play, the protest **MUST** be filed prior to the umpires and the protesting team leaving the field of play. No protest will be allowed following the game. League / Tournament officials will rule on all protests and their decisions shall be final.

Rule 13.01 Comment: Leagues may develop their own method of recording and settling protests.

13.02 The Protest fee is \$100.00 cash. The fee shall be returned only if the protest is upheld.

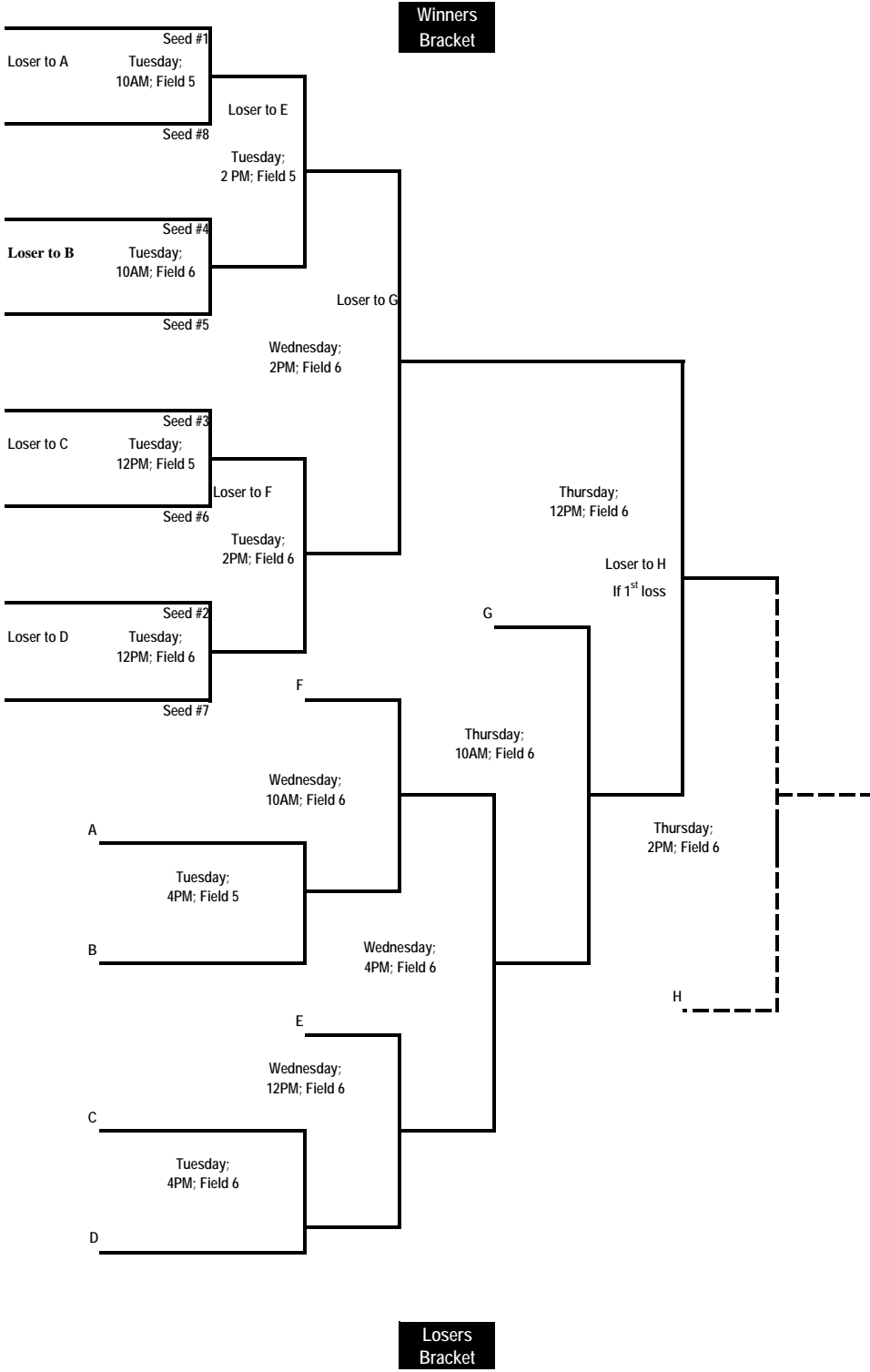

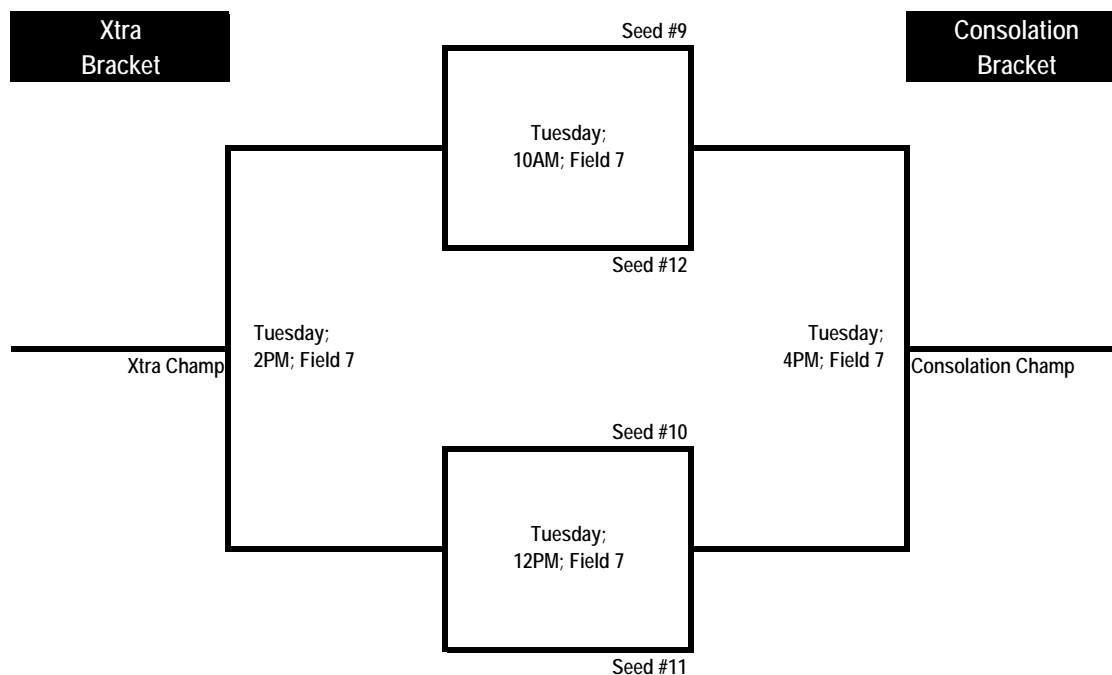
